## Curriculum Guarantees

At Amesbury CE VC Primary School we place a strong emphasis on the importance of increasing the ***cultural capital*** for all of our pupils, and in particular the 21.2% of disadvantaged children in our school (March, 2020) to provide the potential for increased social mobility in their futures. We recognise that in our predominantly white-British school context it is vital for our pupils to also develop their ***cultural literacy*** in order to understand other cultures and increase the value placed on diversity; in turn reducing prejudice and inequality based on culture.

Throughout their educational career at Amesbury Primary School, pupils are provided with the following guarantees that support a developing cultural literacy and provide greater cultural capital.

### Every day, every pupil, will be given the opportunity to:

- Succeed as an individual or as part of a group
- Be challenged and motivated to learn more
- Participate in an act of collective worship
- Read a book matched to their reading and interest level
- Listen to a book or story that is read to them

### Each week, every pupil, will be given the opportunity to:

- Celebrate their own and peer successes in a celebration assembly
- Participate in whole school worship through song
- Visit the school library and take a book home to read

### Every term, every pupil, will be given the opportunity to:

- Visit the local library
- Celebrate important Christian liturgical events
- Share their learning with parents and/or other family members
- Learn outside the classroom

### Every school year, every pupil, will be given the opportunity to:

- Learn about the religious beliefs of another faith
- Perform to an audience
- Visit a Christian place of worship
- Participate in local events (i.e. carnival, summer fayre)
- Go on an educational visit away from the school site
- Have their work published and presented publicly
- Prepare and cook their own meal
- Fundraise for charity

### At least once by the time they leave in Year 6, every pupil will be given the opportunity to:

- Visit the place of worship for a non-Christian faith
- Visit a place of historical significance
- Visit a place of national heritage
- Visit a museum
- Volunteer their own time for the needs of others
- Attend an overnight residential
- Visit an art gallery
- Watch a dance, theatre or musical performance by professionals
